Report on the Use of Capacity Enhancement Grant (CEG) in the 2022-2023 School Year

CEG provides the necessary funds to schools to relieve teachers' workload so that teachers will have enhanced capacity to concentrate on the following three critical tasks in the education reform - (A) curriculum development, including the integration of information technology in teaching; (B) enhancing students' language proficiency; and (C) coping with the diverse and special learning needs of students with varied abilities, ranging from the gifted ones to those with learning difficulties.
